WHO SHOULD ATTEND? Anyone interested in working within the area of dispute resolution in a faith community and who are strongly committed to achieving the learning objectives listed above.

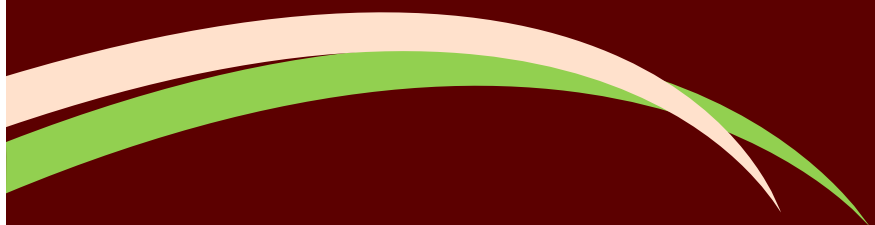
